What is a Precinct?

Precinct defined:


• The smallest division of a state, county, and township, comprised of no more than 2000 active voters. **Active voter** is defined as a voter who has voted in one election in the last four years or has responded to an address confirmation notice. (IC 5-2-1.7)

Purpose of a precinct:

- To maintain local involvement, engagement, and representation in government and political parties.



<u>Government:</u> Governing bodies such as Boone County Commissioners, Boone County Council Districts, and Town/City Council Districts represent specific precincts.

Commissioners Districts

Each Commissioner resides in one of the three districts in Boone County and runs for election based on the district. However, each commissioner represents and is elected by all citizens of the county. Below is a list of the commissioners and their districts.

Additionally, we have provided a map that shows the district boundaries.

County Council Districts

Four of the seven Council Members reside in one of the 4 districts in Boone County. They run for election based on their district and they represent the citizens of that district. Three other Council Members reside in Boone County but are elected as "At-Large" representatives and they represent all citizens in the county. Below is a list of the council members and their districts. Additionally we have provided a map that shows the district boundaries.

<u>Political parties:</u> The Republican party is built "bottom-up" with a precinct committeeman (PC) representing each

precinct.



PC responsibilities: PC qualifications: - Elected every 4 years on a Presidential cycle **Primary:** - Appoint Vice PC - Must reside in the precinct in which s/he runs - Elect County Officials (Chair, Vice Chair, Secretary, Treasurer) - Participate in Caucuses - Primary Republican Voting History (Indiana Additional: State Law & GOP Party Rules) - Be Local Republican Party Advocate - Recruit and Train Volunteers - Turn out the Republican Vote on Election Day - Register New Voters - Update and Correct Voter Name List
